FROM THE DESK OF THE MINISTER

The words from the passage above are from one of our recent lectionary readings, and it fits with what has emerged for me as a theme of 2024. This year, I feel like I have made some good connections with the body that is the ecumenical community in Innisfail.

In June, July and August we shared in worship with our friends from Grace Lutheran, St. Andrew's Presbyterian, and St. Mark's Anglican Churches. I was not able to participate in worshipping at the other churches, as we do have a commitment to maintaining our weekly live stream presence, however representatives from each of those churches meet regularly as we unfolded that plan, and we continued to meet after the summer. There was positive feedback all round, such that we will be doing that shared worship again in the summer of 2025. Also, folks from St. Andrew's Presbyterian worshipped with us a few times in the fall as well, and will continue to join us almost monthly in 2025.

Ministerial is meeting again. We realized after more than a year of not doing so that we were missing an important opportunity to support each other in our ministries. We have set up a quarterly schedule, gathering for lunch at one of our local restaurants. Some of our churches that are without ministry personnel send a member of their governing body to represent their community of faith.

World Day of Prayer Ecumenical service was held at Autumn Grove Lodge in March of 2024. I was on the planning team, which included members from our church and from Our Lady of Peace Catholic Church. Holding the service at Autumn Grove worked very well, and the service was well attended.

We all were saddened by the devasting fires in Jasper National Park. At the invitation of some of our Anglican friends, we have come together to form "The Caring Collective." This is a group of representatives from several of our community's churches, and other individuals in the community. Our first project is to support Jasperite's as they recover. There will be a fundraiser in the spring of 2025, and we are also collecting new quilts and afghans to be given to those who have lost their homes. Just for fun, this group went Christmas carolling at Rosefield and at Autumn Grove. Myself, Lenette VanKuilenburg, and Joanne McCord have been attending those meetings.

Another way connections are being made here at Innisfail United is through our newly formed Outreach Group. After our Chinook Winds Regional meeting in May of 2024, Marlene Stevens had an idea to reach out to the community of folks that live close to our church. She invited people in our church to come together and help with bringing that idea to life. I couldn't be more pleased with the response she got from that invitation, and from the on-going support that group have had from the congregation. Growing from that inspiration, came The "Drop in the Bucket" fund, which has raised enough that it can begin to lend assistance to schools in helping to make sure students who need support with food insecurity get that. They also undertook, on the coldest day of the year in November, to deliver small gift bags with a few treats and information about our church to our neighbours surrounding the church. That endeavour has born some fruit as well!

Pastoral connecting opportunities at Innisfail's senior's residences, Rosefield, Sunset Manor and Autumn Grove are part of my regular routine. I appreciate connecting with the United Church residents, as well as other residents that attend the worship services we hold there, as well as to the Sundae Social events. There's always someone who appreciates a bit of conversation, or a chance to sing their favourite hymn. I appreciate the commitment of the Pastoral Care Committee to being present for those activities and services as well.

For study time this year, I took a 6 week course (evenings once a week) in the winter through Atlantic School of Theology entitled "It's the End of the World as we Know It." It was a walk through the Book of Revelation, in online, primarily lecture format, facilitated by the Principal of AST. Lots of learning!

I really enjoyed the study week session I attended in February at Grace Presbyterian Church in Calgary, on "Playing With the Scriptures" with Rev. Dr. Richard Topping, the President of Vancouver School of Theology. I also used some of the week to do some planning for Lent.

I took a week of study leave in September, most of which I spent in Drumheller at the bi-annual gathering of the Diaconate of the United Church (we call ourselves DUCC's). It was a great time of connecting with friends and colleagues from across the country. The theme time was looking at the Future of the Church, and the role of diaconal ministry in that future. Our United Church General Secretary, Rev. Michael Blair was the theme speaker.

I so appreciate the commitment of those who give of their time and talent to serve on committees, on the board, as readers, servers, greeters, gardeners, tech support, and maintenance work. The team of people that bless us with their musical gifts never cease to touch my spirit, whether at the piano or with their singing.

I am also grateful for the wonderful staff team here, Candice, Joanne, Janelle, and Jill. It is a pleasure to serve with all of you.

As we live into the 100th Anniversary of being part of The United Church of Canada, may God continue to bless us with gifts to share.

2024, started out with a burst water pipe in the basement Sunday School room. The six rooms adjacent, were affected, Paul Davis was called in. They started with the drying out process, huge fans and heaters, ran for a time. A lot of the furniture, toys and stored items had to be thrown out, due to water damage. Bob Zinken dealt with the insurance company, and he said the process was seamless. We decided to paint the rooms, we still have a couple to complete. The flooring lightened up the whole basement, the flooring continued into the hallway, which makes it look so clean and modern. While looking at the whole basement, the front windows needed replacement and insulation of the outside walls, the rooms are warmer.

The small kitchen was modernized and paid for with fundraising. Other projects – removal of cement from driveway – Paint around the front door of the church—steam clean the rugs. Maintenance is necessary, and the congregation always recognises this.


